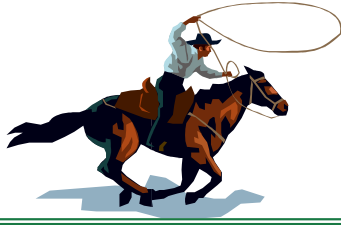

Outbound Exchange to Hamilton & Waikato by Tony Adams

The Friendship Force of Hamilton and Waikato provided a warm welcome and outstanding home stay week to Tony, Donna, and Jone, and Judy Greenberg of the Long Island FF Club, along with 14 ambassadors from Southern New Jersey and 2 from Thunder Bay, Ontario, Canada. The city has had two clubs for many years and recently came together to form just one club, with this inward exchange being the first for the combined clubs. The members showcased some of the attractions that made them proud to live and work in a beautiful part of the world.

The minute that the bus picked us all up in Auckland, given a tour of the city including the War Memorial Museum, and taken to Hamilton, to the ending Farewell Dinner, we were treated like ambassadors, who all became family members at the end of our home stay. Starting with a

welcoming reception at a member's home, we had a chance to socialize and meet our home hosts. During the next several days, we toured agricultural areas learning a lot about the livestock and dairy industry and its history, and visited numerous flower, fruit, vegetable, antique, and sculpture gardens. A major highlight was a van trip to the Rotorua area which included the Buried Village that was the result of 1886 Mount Tarawera volcano eruption, and

experienced Te Puia's Maori Arts and Crafts Institute, the world famous Pohutu Geyser, mud pools, a Maori concert, and, finally, a Hangi meal.

Most of the meals included fresh fruit and vegetables from the members' gardens, including the Farewell dinner which included meat and chicken and a variety of desserts. Tony presented donations on behalf of the New Zealand and the Southern New Jersey clubs, along with Cheyenne's contribution, to the ShelterBox organization. Mountain States Regional Conference in Salt Lake City

Attending the Mountain States Regional Conference from Cheyenne were **Terry Udell, Jan Peterson-Udell, Ramona Knipper** and myself, **Donna Mae Logan**.

Conference began on Friday, May 2nd with a city bus tour of the Salt Lake City Area. Sometimes we wondered if the bus was going to make it up the hills. We went by the Tabernacle Square, Historic Homes of the Mormon Pioneers and Church Leaders, State Capitol, Monuments, Gardens, Fort Douglas and many others. We were on our own for dinner.

Saturday, May 3rd began the conference with a Continental Breakfast and mixing and checking out posters from other clubs. Our keynote speaker was **Joy DiBenedetto**, President/CEO of Friendship Force International. She spoke on the FFC Int'l Board consisting of 10 US Members and 5 Around the World, The first African board member was appointed. All board members serve four year terms. This is the most international board ever appointed.

“Changing the Way You See the World” one handshake and one smile at a time was her theme.

The past year we have placed the Friendship Force flag on the North Pole and was one of three exhibitors selected by the Olympic committee to display at the 2014 Olympics in Russia.

Laurie Ann Scott did a survey of all 110 North American presidents in 2014 on membership, age and club approaches to meetings. Club Dues varied amongst clubs from \$10-\$55. Single and Family. Also Joy reported that hosting fees of the clubs and 76% felt they were inefficient. She also reported Exchange Directors are compensated for their expenses 61% do reimburse and 29% do not.

Joy stated that leadership is the most difficult to obtain and some clubs have gone to leadership councils instead of officers and it works quite well for them

Joy also mentioned one of the challenges clubs have is bring in younger members and many surveyed said it was cost of hosting and traveling. She suggested telling them stories and involve them in activities. Newsletters to keep them informed (Later on in the day one of the workshops dealt with this issued and speakers presented suggestions). Sister clubs, social clubs and reaching out to the community and become involved as a club. Of the 362 clubs in the FF only 110 have websites. [ed: We Do!]

Of the 15,338 members only 5135 members travel. One of the ways FF is going to assist with international travel is to increase the areas and be able to offer more requests. There will be a **Global Expansion Plan** coming out in two weeks. Some of the projects being worked on by FFI are talking to **Delta Air Lines** and a getting a discounted air fare for FFI members. They will also talk to the other airlines and to AARP. Try and get better relationship with organizations that can benefit both FFI and the company. In November 8-15 (I'm sorry I don't remember if it was this year or next) there will be the Nobel Festival in Atlanta and they are working on having the FFI clubs being the greeters and help with this convention.

She was a great speaker and had a lot of new and fresh ideas. I only covered the highlights.

The workshops the rest of the day consisted of "Promotion and Publicity", "Unleash the Great Photographer Within You" (good speaker and humorous). "Packing & Travel Tips" (She opened the business Travel Outfitters at 9:00PM after we finished the banquet so we could shop www.ILCTravelOutiffiters.com). Two members gave presentations on "Mentoring New Members" and "Keeping New Members Engaged". A question and answer period with the speakers of the day other than packing and camera was held.

The session closed with a banquet and entertainment. **Denise Wheeler** (SLC Chapter; but lives in Evanston, WY) was awarded the **Wayne Smith Medal**. In two years the Mountain States Regional Conference will be held in Grand Junction
