Cheyenne Friendship Force discussed the letter from Jack Mullen, Chair FFI Board of Directors letter discussing Setting FFI on a Sustainable Course requesting information from members. President, John Kaiser asked someone to take notes and I volunteered. Here are my notes.

Question #1: Fill-the-Seat Policy-- 21 members present discussed the policy of posting the under-filled exchanges be posted 100 days on the FF Catalogue. Tim offered a motion to agree to policy, second not recorded, group agreed

Question #2: Online Members—Discussion centered on vetting applicants and the payment of dues to Atlanta. Jim Weber moved to accept, Jan Behrens seconded and motion was accepted.

Question #3 Domestic and European Exchanges: Board Decision to correct perceived inequities between ambassador fees by setting them at \$10 per night. Cheyenne FF voted “No” on Tim’s motion on the question but Yes on a new motion to \$10 with a limit of \$50. Mabel seconded the motion and group concurred.

Question about group preferences regarding a model: Group discussed the question and preferred the single destination model but agreed that each exchange would depend on the director’s request.

Tim reported on the LCCC Scholarship Dinner. Kazuo Toma(sp ?) the student from Okinawa who received Cheyenne FF Scholarship has been invited to attend a club meeting in 2015.

The club voted to spend the \$100 check from Spokane for Friday Food Bags.

Barbara Guilford asked Dorothy Sims to comment on the OVER THE MOUNTAIN books by Charlene Terrell that she is donating to our club for new members to read. Donna Logan, Jone Jones, and Mabel Wilson checked out the books for reading.

Donna Logan asked for checks for the Christmas Party and Dues sent to her by November 21.

2015 Club Officers, President John Kaiser, Vice President Tim Bolin were accepted by unanimous ballot. John Lee was elected Treasurer. The group will vote for Secretary in December.

Those present enjoyed a delicious Pot Luck Dinner that included dishes from Charleston, WV and Dennis Guilford won the McDonald’s Gift Card.
