CHEYENNE FRIENDSHIP FORCE MEETING MINUTES: March 12, 2018

**Dave Bentzin**, President, introduced our guests: **Parid Shkoza**, our guest speaker and his wife, **Chenoa Baird** and **Ginger Anderson**, **Barbara Eakin**, **Marina Siebert**, **Fran Fox**, and **Graham Myers**.

Twenty one members and seven guests enjoyed the pot luck dinner.

**Marilyn Pettit** and other members decorated the tables with souvenirs from past journeys. Dave thanked Marilyn and her helpers for their work.

Marilyn also arranged visits from club members and guests dressed in traditional clothing from Kosovo, Colombia, Japan, Mexico, and Russia. They passed out World Friendship Day magnets.

Dave presented information from the Board meeting held earlier today.
